Notes from the Headteacher's Study



Kindness and appreciation

Kindness was the theme of our Year 1Sharman Assembly this morning. They spoke about acts of kindness and making people feel appreciated. It was a lovely Assembly with challenges for us all! They spoke so clearly and sang beautifully. It was also fantastic to have 1Sharman parents join us and celebrate with their children.

Year 1 also recognised that we are approaching the season of Lent. They told us that some people give things up to show good self-control but also that some people take things on during lent, such as being kinder. For some of our pupils, they have also entered the season of Ramadan. Ramadan also involves fasting (giving up food/drink) during sunlight hours, another sacrificial act to think of others and have a sense of spiritual discipline.

This week I visited a school in Wembley Park, London. The children sit in groups of six for their lunch within the hall / canteen and at the end of the meal, each pupil must give an 'appreciation' of someone else. At their school it is appreciation of an adult or teacher who had helped them, but this got me thinking wider. I like the idea of ringfencing time to thank someone as this is another act of kindness. It should be anyone who has made a difference: a friend, a stranger, another pupil or member of staff, a parent or grandparent. So many choices! Last half term our Assembly theme was 'Thankfulness'. The children quickly learnt that being thankful created an attitude of gratitude within us.

5Hawking - amazing lesson observation

I had the upmost pleasure spending time observing a lesson in Year 5 Hawking this week. Observing teaching and learning really is the best part of my job, as I get to see the children in action and then have a deeper learning conversation with the teacher afterwards. I saw amazing work in English with a Geography and survival thread running through it. The children were so knowledgeable about what they would need to find and do if they were stranded in the jungle, all linked to a text they had read last half term.

Remember more and applying more is a real focus at King's Northway and has been for many years. Seeing the evidence of how much they had remembered about not only survival, but the text type itself was brilliant. I saw the children discussing, peer talking, using inference and finally imperative and modal verbs to create instructions for a guidebook on survival.

Thank you, Year 5, and thank you Miss Skarrats.
