I wish each pupil, member of staff and member of our family the most fantastic summer, before we gather once more in September for another exciting year!

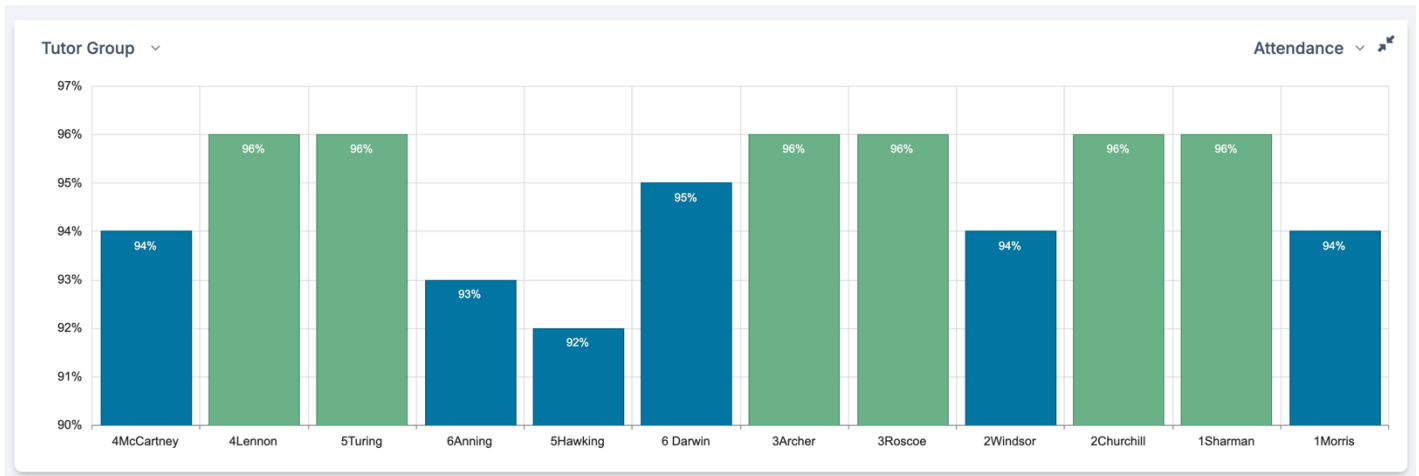

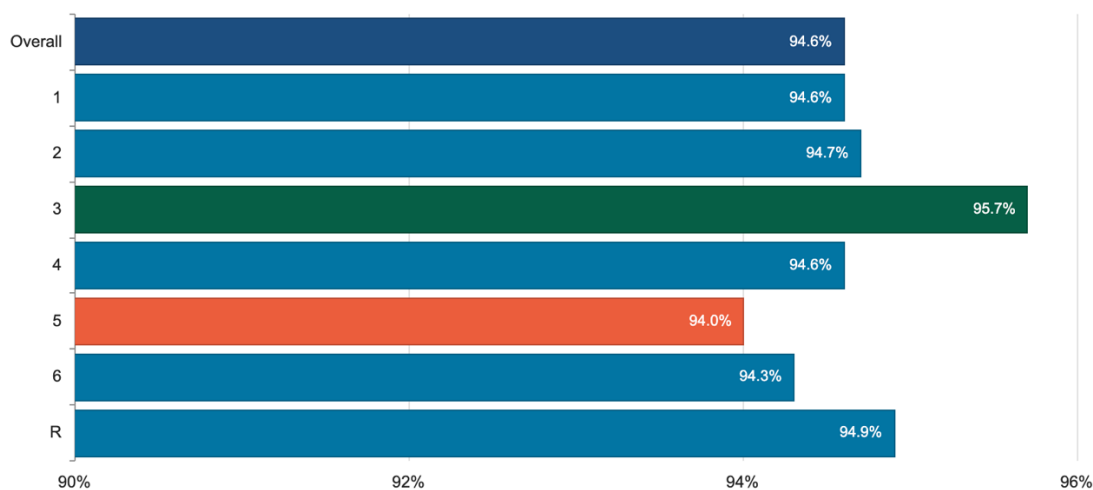
As a School we strive each year to reach 97% Attendance, being very happy with 95%+.
