

Wraparound offer:

Our refreshed Wrap-Around Offer will be sent home tonight or tomorrow for you to consider. On Monday we were audited by Liverpool City Council who looked at our current offer and at our refreshed offer. The auditor had a great time with us and emailed some great feedback.

Wraparound

Our 2025/26 Wraparound offer for children across school including Nursery has been enhanced and refreshed. KNPA Wrap-around has three distinct strands:

- Breakfast and After School similar to now with tiny tweaks
- Paid Coaches / paid clubs to train the children for an hour
- Free Staff enrichment clubs

Children will be able to access the first hour of paid or free sessions, then go into After School Club for the reminder of the time or go home. The aim of this is to provide high quality wraparound care to enable you to function easier as a family, collect other siblings or manage childcare around your work pattern / shifts. A full Offer will be sent out to parents once we have clarified the final detail.

Our prices for Breakfast and Afterschool have not changed in a decade. We have had to review the costings at this point to ensure clubs break-even which in turn ensures wider funding for all pupils is not lost. We have ensured there are **free options** each day.

Diwali:

On Monday we learnt about Diwali in Assembly, and we also had a go learning a piece of Indian Dancing. This was because Diwali was celebrated globally last Monday by the Hindu, Sikh and Jain community.
